Example: Proverbs 1:7 says, "The fear of the LORD is the beginning of all knowledge." Proverbs 9:10 says, "The fear of the LORD is the beginning of wisdom."

In these passages, the word "fear" does not mean fright or unwarranted terror, but reverence, awe, veneration, or deep respect.

PRINCIPLE: We start to get wisdom when we hold the LORD in awe because we trust what He said. OR..."Worship music (which causes us to develop a deep respect for the LORD) will open us up to wisdom and knowledge...OR...People who reverence God tend to be wise
